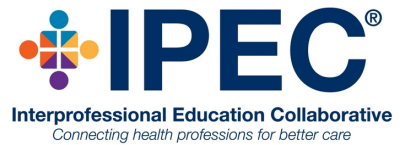
Participants must be from IPEC member association schools. Topics include the following:
